D Please read the U.S. Coast Guard Captain's License Requirements below:

--- U. S. COAST GUARD CAPTAIN'S LICENSE REQUIREMENTS ---

KNOWLEDGE: The knowledge requirement is satisfied by a series of written examinations. We provide you with the necessary textbooks, navigation charts, plotting instruments and professional instruction required to prepare you for successful completion of these examinations. We also administer the exams for the Coast Guard so you will not be required to take any more exams after completing our course. (Please note that the USCG reserves the right to occasionally retest selected students as a means of insuring quality control of approved training schools such as *Dyess Maritime Consultants*). The required exams for the OUPV license are: Rules of the Road (30-questions for Inland or Great Lakes and additional 20-questions for near coastal with a minimum passing score of 90%), Navigation Plotting (10-questions with a minimum passing score of 70%), and Deck General and Safety (70-questions with a minimum passing score of 70%). The Master Mariner license requires an addition 60-question exam (minimum passing score of 70%) covering advanced subjects. These exams are administered at various stages throughout the course rather than all at once at the end.

EXPERIENCE: The experience questions are answered by USCG sea service forms you complete and submit with your license application. Both the OUPV and the Master Mariner licenses require a minimum of 360 days of boating experience -- 90 days of which must have been obtained within the past three years. The near coastal waters endorsement for the OUPV requires a minimum of 90 days off-shore. This 90 day requirement is NOT restricted to the last three years. The near coastal waters endorsement for the Master Mariner license requires a minimum of 720 days total experience with 360 days of it off-shore. We provide the required forms and assist you with their proper completion.

HEALTH: You prove satisfactory health by taking a complete physical administered by a MD of your choice. We will provide the required US Coast Guard forms for your physician to complete. During class, we will emphasize those mistakes most commonly made when filling out the forms to allow you to avoid those pitfalls.

CITIZENSHIP: Good citizenship is demonstrated by the successful completion of a drug test, a criminal background check conducted by the USCG, and the submission of either a passport or original birth certificate and your social security card.

TRANSPORTATION WORKER IDENTIFICATION CREDENTIAL (TWIC): The U.S. Coast Requires all merchant mariners to obtain a TWIC. We will discuss this in class in detail. Please visit the National Maritime Center for more information at http://www.uscg.mil/nmc/mmc_twic_announcements.asp

You must also have current First Aid and CPR certifications. Both must have been issued within the last 12 months.

Absence from class: Attendance is required.

Examination requirements:

- Each exam may be taken a maximum of three times.
- Exam scores only will be given to the student. If a student chooses to protest an exam question, he/she may turn in a protest form with their examination.
- During the exam no student is allowed to leave the examination room until the exam has been turned in for scoring.
- □ **Inappropriate behavior:** Tardiness and or absenteeism, drug and or alcohol use (either before or during the class), or other inappropriate behavior may result in dismissal from the course.
- Certificate of Completion: The Certificate of Completion will not be issued until all class hours and exam requirements have been met and is valid for one year
